

An intensive Hepatology training program, which includes immersion in clinical hepatology (with weekly clinical rounds on all in-patients in the Department, every other weekly pathology meeting with live cases discussed with Pathology and our specialists), outpatient hepatology clinic performing 10 thousand consultations per year, experience with all types of liver biopsy (including EUS and trans jugular), ultrasound and liver and spleen elastography. The latest update

The Suva Training Center focus is on: Hepatology topics are taught directly to the diploma of Medicine and Master of Medicine in the formal post graduate program through FNU. The teaching occurs during the month-long gastro program hosted at the WGO Training Center with FNU team and ANZGITA team. Ad hoc teaching may occur during that month including grand round topics, informal teaching within the endoscopy program (maybe short tutorials cases etc.) and on ward rounds with staff and students. Cases are often discussed remotely between colleagues, for example for weeks ago Prof. Chris Hair was discussing a referral for a liver transplant with a Fijian consultant. The Training Center has no liver transplant access and no Fibro scan. A significant amount of work and effort has been developed with Dr Alice Lee, hepatitis B free foundation and the Fiji MOH and its staff around liver disease and viral hepatitis. This is a component of a broader effort across the pacific with Prof. Alice Lee team to assist island countries in their efforts to treat and minimize harm from hepatitis B infection. This is both an educational and development program, and an exemplar to the world.

WGO La Plata Training Center The latest update

Since 2007, the WGO La Plata Advanced Training Center has continued to train young gastroenterologists from all over Latin America. The center is part of a hospital of the public health system, with a training unit with more than 25 years of experience, assisting patients in one of the largest districts in Argentina. The great demand for care means that various pathologies can be treated, many of which are highly complex, said Martin Yantorno.

To provide an adequate and quality response, the center has been incorporating technologies for access to the entire population, along with advanced endoscopic practices.

Third Space Endoscopy

Together with the Neurogastroenterology unit, the Training Center performs high-resolution manometry studies for the diagnosis and characterization of patients with achalasia. These patients are then treated with the POEM technique, associating monitoring with EndoFlip during the procedure to ensure better results said Martin Yantorno.

The Training Center continues with the treatment of mucosal lesions with suspected superficial submucosal invasion with an approach using endoscopic submucosal dissection. In addition, certain subepithelial lesions are treated under resection through submucosal tunneling.

Interventional Ultrasound Endoscopy

In recent years we have been constantly training in interventional techniques by echo-endoscopy, in ultrasound-guided biliary drainage techniques (choledochoduode-nostomy and hepatic-gastrostomy) and gastroenteroanastomosis, with excellent technical and clinical results in our patients. "We also perform ultrasound-guided radiofrequency techniques for the treatment of neuroendocrine tumors," said Martin Yantorno.

Simulation in endoscopic training

In recent years we have acquired highquality mechanical simulators for the training of our fellows in upper and lower digestive endoscopy and ERCP. "These simulators allow us to improve learning curves, achieve competence and perfect basic and advanced techniques before practicing them on patients," said Martin.

The Training Center will continue working to improve their teaching techniques and learning models for their fellows, seeking to provide quality medical care!!

WGO Porto Training Center was the noncommercial sponsor of an extremely popular yearly initiative, the "Corrida de S.João" (St John Run), celebrating and anticipating the festivities of S. João on June the 23rd, an important patron of the town and also of many regions in Portugal. Our Training Center, based in Hospital S.João, Porto, assumed this great opportunity to advertise and promote Digestive Health, which in fact became the motto for this year's 10 km run and 7km walk, allowing the athletes and public to enjoy the magnificent view that unites the Douro River and the Atlantic Ocean throughout the course.

The support to this event was meant to raise curiosity and draw large attention to the benefits of physical exercise in Digestive Health. WGO Khartoum Training Center The latest update

After the beginning of the Sudan war in April 2023, the Khartoum Training Center, along with the National Center for Gastrointestinal and Liver Diseases, managed to relocate to the city of Medani, 180 kilometers south of Khartoum. The center successfully reinstated gastroenterology services within three months, as published in the September 2023 issue of the WGO newsletter.

The center was able to provide endoscopy, gastroenterology, hepatobiliary, and pancreatic services with the support of the Federal Ministry of Health and Gezira Ministry of Health. The main challenge was retaining trained personnel in the fields of gastroenterology, hepatobiliary, and liver transplantation. The center managed to retain 70% of these staff members by working at the Gezira Center for Endoscopy and Laparoscopic Surgery.

Within five months, the center performed 350 ERCPs and over 60 hepatobiliary and pancreatic surgeries, serving many wardisplaced individuals from all states of Sudan. Additionally, the center trained two consultant gastroenterologists in ERCP and more than 30 fellows in general medicine and surgery.



Unfortunately, the city of Medani was attacked by Rapid Support Forces on December 15, 2023, leading to the displacement of the city's residents and wardisplaced individuals to other cities, which caused the collapse of medical services, including gastroenterology services.

Out of the box initiatives, always raising Gastroenterology in its different settings.

The latest update

Kassala, in eastern Sudan, was chosen to be the new gastroenterology hub. Preparations began for a new center to provide these services, but this time, the center lost 80% of its workforce. However, the center did not stop. The major challenge was continuing to provide ERCP services, which had been absent throughout Sudan for the past three months. The center managed to reinstate these services, overcoming all difficulties with support from the Federal Ministry of Health, the Kassala Ministry of Health, and the Advanced Diagnostic Center administration.

One major challenge was finding a fluoroscopy machine. The center was able to utilize a C-arm, which was part of a nonfunctioning urology lithotripsy machine. The lithotripsy part was non-functional, but the C-arm was working. The main obstacle we faced was the table used for the procedure, which was customized for urology services. The staff faced difficulty moving the C-arm through the urology table.

Additionally, the mirroring image of the fluoroscopy had a right and left mirror image but not an up-down mirroring, and the fluoroscopy image for the ERCP position was up-down. To overcome these issues, we designed a locally made table and fixed the screen up-down, resolving these issues.

After the first five cases, we encountered the challenge of displaying the fluoroscopy image on a single screen, which was fixed in the C-arm, for both the radiology technician and the endoscopist, said Dr. Abdo. To overcome this, the staff managed to connect the C-arm to another screen using DVR (Digital Video Recording) technology from security cameras. This helped them overcome this issue. In addition, they used this technology to record all cases' fluoroscopic and endoscopic views. The center is considering using it for live demonstrations and conference participation, as they have done this before but with the help of a professional team.

From *March 26 to May 15*, the center performed 170 biliary ERCP cases, with three lists per week, each list serving no fewer than six patients, plus an additional list if there were patients waiting. This is because 90% of them come from other states, as shown in the graph. We are trying to resolve those issues and refer patients back to their referring doctors.

Currently, the center is training three gastroenterologists and nursing staff. The center is now thinking of establishing ERCP services in at least two other states.

The center is currently developing an ERCP fellowship program. The proposal has been written, and consultations are ongoing with many colleagues in this field and the Sudan Gastroenterology Fellowship program on how to approve the proposal and grant certification.

There is no benefit in war, but we must deal with its negative consequences and turn them into positive actions that benefit those affected by the war. We will never give up, said Dr. Abdo
