

Programs / Services

Training

Education and Training represents a core primary program for WGO. Since 1998, WGO has provided training and education to the global gastroenterology community reaching over 2,500 trainees through its 24 Training Centers and over 1,300 participants from 100 countries through its Train the Trainers courses.

Through fostering cultural competency, interdisciplinary collaboration, and resilience, premedical students emerge as compassionate and capable healthcare providers who are poised to address health disparities across different cultures.

The role of WGO and its interest in encouraging students to continue studying in large Training Centers with the guidance of people trained in different areas is remarkable.

Training Centers

WGO endorses 24 centers globally in Asia-Pacific, Europe, Africa/Middle East and the Americas. WGO awarded grants to a number of trainees so that they may attend a training course at a WGO Training Center in 2023. 11 Training Centers were awarded Educational Activity funds to support their efforts.



In 2023, WGO inaugurated its latest Training Center in Brasília, Brazil. This center celebrated its grand opening on 15 July 2023 and is under the direction of Prof. Liliana Sampaio Costa Mendes. The mission of this Training Center is to further assist in the medical education and training of gastrointestinal diseases and provide the highest level of medical care to the local population.

Train the Trainers

In 2023, Train the Trainers launched new and creative initiatives to further innovate the realm of educational workshops and expand the global community of WGO. The TTT course continues to utilize multiple teaching methods including lectures, small group breakouts with report back, active learning workshops, combined with social activities. A new addition to the program this year was the introduction of a TTT Teaser. This shortened course was held over two days, alongside the Romanian National Congress of Gastroenterology, and gave a glimpse into what a full educational course may be like. Also, in collaboration with the Colombian Association of Gastroenterology, WGO proudly launched the Spanish version of the Advanced TTT in Medical Education in Pereira, Colombia.

Isai, Romania, 6-7 June 2023

This abbreviated version of the course aimed to provide a taste of what is covered in a TTT, help participants become better medical educators and inspire future participation in our Train the Trainers courses. The first day consisted of an hour and a half worth of modules with day two consisting of four hours. This teaser included an adult education workshop, lectures, breakouts, and report back sessions.



Pereira, Colombia, 16-18 August 2023

Expanding the Train the Trainers course to two days of content allowed for the introduction of several new Med Ed modules, while also repurposing other existing modules into more interactive workshops. Having fun while learning remains a key component to the success of TTT. Despite the shortened duration of the course, we were able to visit the beautiful town of Filandia during our local tour. While enjoying a great dinner, we learned how to prepare the perfect cup of Colombian coffee accompanied by endless memories of singing and dancing!



Introduction of New Modules

Simulation in Med Ed. - Although simulation has long been a part of a TTT course by using endoscopy simulators to demonstrate how to teach a skill, there has never been a formal module dedicated to the role of simulation in medical education. Participants learned that simulation is a teaching technique rather than a technology.

Learner in Difficulty – This new module highlighted that identifying "problem trainees" is important because it predicts future problems, such as unprofessional behaviors, and because remediation works!

Communication and Conflict Resolution – This workshop allowed participants to learn the importance of active listening and non-verbal communication. While practicing their negotiations skills, the participants had fun engaging in the "Two Dollar Game" activity.

Innovation and Scholarship – The module introduced participants on how to design quality studies in Med Ed., including the importance of a proper literature review. It contrasted quantitative and qualitative research methodologies and highlighted a mixed methods study "the flipped classroom" as a recent innovation in medical education.

Education

WGO Global Guidelines and Cascades

The WGO Guidelines Library contains 27 practice guidelines that are globally applicable by the nature of their cascades, which identify other ways of achieving the best possible outcome by taking the available resources into account. While each guideline includes references to other relevant guidelines, WGO is the only organization which has adopted a global focus. In addition, each guideline review team includes non-Western experts with direct knowledge of conditions in their regions. The *Journal of Clinical Gastroenterology (JCG)* is the official publication platform for the WGO's Global Guidelines in the English language.

Newly Published Updated Guidelines in the JCG in 2023

- Obesity
- Probiotics and Prebiotics

The **Obesity Guideline** was published in partnership with the International Federation for the Surgery of Obesity and Metabolic Disorders (IFSO). This joint IFSO and WGO effort gives clinicians a tool to use when dealing with people with obesity. The Guideline was led by Drs. Scott Shikora (USA), Reem Sharaiha (USA), Kevin P. White (Canada), Guilherme Macedo (Portugal), James Toouli (Australia) and Lilian Kow (Australia). Prof. Macedo is President of WGO (2021-2023) and Prof. Toouli is a Past President of WGO (2013-2015).

An Executive Summary as well as the "Methodology and results of a joint IFSO-WGO Delphi Survey of 94 intercontinental, interdisciplinary experts in obesity management" were also released in conjunction with the updated Obesity Guideline.

The **Probiotics and Prebiotics Guideline** was led by Prof. Francisco Guarner, MD, PhD, a clinical gastroenterologist and researcher in probiotics and prebiotics in Spain, and brought together experts in gastroenterology, pediatrics, family medicine, probiotics, and prebiotics. Prof. Hania Szajewska, MD, PhD, a clinical pediatrician and clinical researcher in probiotics from the Medical University of Warsaw, Poland, was integral to assessing evidence for pediatric populations for the guidelines. Mary Ellen Sanders PhD of the International Scientific Association for Probiotics and Prebiotics (ISAPP) co-chaired the project. The Review Team of international experts consisted of Drs. Henry Cohen (Uruguay), Rami Eliakim (Israel), Claudia Herrera (Guatemala), Tarkan Karakan (Türkiye), Dan Merenstein (USA), Alejandro Piscoya (Peru), Balakrishnan Ramakrishna (India), and Seppo Salminen (Finland).

Webinars

In 2023, WGO created and produced 15 webinars on a wide range of topics and specialties. Webinars are used as a free online educational tool to provide our members with access to digestive healthcare experts and their abundance of knowledge and experience. The online courses featured both live and pre-recorded sessions. All these resources were provided at no-cost and all recorded webinars became accessible on WGO's website.

Women in GI Webinar Series 22 Feb. – 13 Dec.

This quarterly webinar series brought together women leading their fields and male allies from around the world. Throughout the series many powerful discussions were had surrounding the obstacles, stereotypes and opportunities women in medicine are presented with.

Liver Disease in Pregnancy: Navigating the Complexities on a Global Scale 17 April

In celebration of World Liver Day, WGO's Hepatology Committee created a webinar with a focus on pregnancy and liver disease in a cascade approach. Topics covered included viral hepatitis in pregnancy, pregnancy specific liver diseases, chronic liver disease in pregnancy and autoimmune hepatitis, and more!

DILI Diagnosis: More Than Guilt By Association 19 June

The webinar was focused on the identification and diagnosis of drug- and herb-induced liver injury. Each topic was chosen based on a key publication that addressed an important challenge in drug-induced liver injury. Topics included an algorithm to identify drug-induced liver injury, the genetic risk score for the diagnosis, a causality assessment of herbal and dietary supplement induced liver injury and several others.







Webinars, continued

WGO's Climate Course on Global Gastroenterology

WGO's Climate Change Committee's objective is to assist GI health providers worldwide to adapt to, and mitigate, the effects of climate change on health. In 2023 the Committee had members from 18 countries representing high, medium and low-income populations. It aimed to review the scientific literature on climate and GI health, to encourage education, and the undertaking of actionable measures including advocacy, and to further research and collaborations within the global GI community.


To increase awareness and educate health providers, WGO broadcast a series of nine interactive webinars, one hour each, occurring every two weeks from March until June 2023. We assembled experts from around the world who are the leading authorities on the subjects that were presented. Upon completion of this course attendees had a clear understanding of the issues and are now prepared to take positive actions to help adapt to, and mitigate, climate change.

The topics were:

- 1. Overview of Course and Climate Change Fundamentals
- 2. Climate Change and GI Health
- 3. Food, Water Security, and Vulnerable Populations
- 4. Adaptation, Resilience, and Industry Partnership
- 5. Understanding the Carbon Footprint of GI Care
- 6. Greening Endoscopy and Reducing Waste
- 7. Personal, Systems Advocacy, and Nursing Efforts to Mitigate the Climate Crisis
- 8. Perspectives on Pediatric Health, Trainees, and Early Career Providers
- 9. Building a Brighter, Sustainable, and Better Future

Gut Commentary Series on Digestive Health and Climate Change

WGO was pleased to work with *Gut* to publish a compendium of nine commentaries, each summarizing one, or a hybrid, of the educational webinars. These nine commentaries published by Gut in the December 2023 issue were coauthored by the webinar speakers and colleagues and provide a synopsis of the webinar topics and related resources and references. They also serve as a compendium of the impact of climate change on gastrointestinal health for readers worldwide to use.



Outreach / Advocacy

World Digestive Health Day (WDHD) 2023

Every 29th May, WGO celebrates World Digestive Health Day (WDHD) and initiates a worldwide, public health campaign through 119 WGO Member Societies, which reach over 65,000 individuals worldwide, WGO Training Centers, Regional Affiliate Associations and other WGO global partners. Each year focuses upon a particular digestive disease and/or disorder in order to increase general public awareness of prevention, prevalence, diagnosis, management and treatment of the disease and/or disorder.

The theme for World Digestive Health Day 2023 was "Your Digestive Health: A Healthy Gut From the Start."



WGO remains committed to providing simple messages for the general public in order to assist in the understanding of the important role of diet in GI health, and we shared the following resources during this campaign. These sites give practical information for adults, children, patients, and providers about healthy diet and other healthy habits.

GIKids.org - Geared towards children, parents, and healthcare professionals, GI Kids offers comprehensive and reliable information on pediatric digestive disorders, liver diseases, and nutritional concerns

The Doc's Kitchen - Healthy recipes, eating resources, videos, and more are available to help you and your patients lead a healthier and happier life

Healthy Eating for Children - Emphasizes the important role of caregivers of children in learning healthy eating habits, such as three meals a day and one to three healthy snacks a day

Advice for Parents of Healthy-Weight Children - Advice for parents of healthy-weight children, such as role modeling, physical activity, child size portions, and how to pack a healthy school lunch

Dietary Guidelines for Americans - Addresses every part of the life span: infants and toddlers, children and adolescents, adults, pregnant women, and older adults

As part of the campaign, WGO members were asked to take a selfie card photo, amplifying short messages related to colorectal cancer prevention and screening efforts. Healthcare professionals and the public shared their photos with WGO, with submissions received from all parts of the world. Meetings

General Assembly

The General Assembly is comprised of representatives from all WGO member societies and regional associations. The members of the assembly review the work of the Governing Council, vote on amendments to the WGO statutes and bylaws, as well as approve the election of WGO officers. The General Assembly also ratifies the selected bid for each World Congress of Gastroenterology. There shall be only one vote for each member society. In 2023, WGO held two General Assembly meetings, one in May and one in December.

May

The first assembly took place in-person at Digestive Disease Week 2023 (DDW) in Chicago, Illinois, USA. WGO President Prof. Guilherme Macedo addressed the member society representatives and provided an overview of recent accomplishments within the organization. Also, inside of this meeting was the formal approval of two new member societies joining WGO, the Haitian Gastroenterology Association and Societe Malienne des Maladies de l'Appareil Digestif (SOMMAD). There was diverse representation from around the world and many society leaders in attendance.



December

The second General Assembly of 2023 was offered virtually. During this meeting Prof. Guilherme Macedo thanked those in attendance for their

support during his presidency and thanked those rotating off the Governing Council at the start of 2024. Prof. Macedo introduced Prof. Geoffrey Metz as the incoming President and welcomed in his new leadership. Additional highlights of the meeting included the ratifications of new Governing Council members, approval of changes inside of WGO bylaws and the announcement of several new committees including the Media and Community Engagement Committee, Climate Change Committee and IBD Committee.
